

Transfer to Pitt Business from the Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC)

The College of Business Administration (Pitt Business) awards the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA) degree with majors in:

- Accounting
- Business Analytics
- Business Information Systems
- Finance
- Global Management
- Human Resources Management
- Marketing
- Supply Chain Management

Pitt Business is fully accredited by AACSB International, the premier accrediting agency for collegiate programs in business. In addition, Pitt Business is ranked a top-25 public undergraduate business program by *U.S. News and World Report*.

Transfer Application to Pitt Business

Admission is available for the Fall (August), Spring (January), and Summer (May) semesters on a rolling basis. To ensure full consideration, please apply one semester before you intend to enroll. The BSBA Program may be completed full-time or part-time.

CCAC students planning to transfer to Pitt Business have 2 options:

- CCAC/Pitt Business Articulation Agreement, CCAC Associate's degree program – see further on in this document
- Plan for Transfer (Non-Associate's degree option) – see information below

For students not pursuing an Associate's degree at CCAC (the Articulation Agreement), it is recommended that you transfer to Pitt Business after completing approximately 45-60 credits. **Among those credits should be: ECO 102 Macroeconomics, ECO 103 Microeconomics, and MAT 220 Business Calculus.**

Courses that will transfer to Pitt Business and fulfill requirements:

- MAT 220 Business Calculus (required)
- ENG 101 English Composition 1
- ENG 102 English Composition 2

- BUS 101 Introduction to Business
- BUS 103 Principles of Management
- BUS 104 Principles of Marketing
- You can also fulfill the humanities, social sciences, and natural science requirements included in the Articulation Agreement below. The social sciences requirement (two courses) and natural science requirement (one course) are as shown in the Agreement. However, students not pursuing the CCAC Associate's degree can take two humanities courses instead of one. The two courses should be chosen from two different areas, picking from English Literature, Music/Art, and Philosophy.

Admissions Criteria

To be competitive for admission, we suggest that you earn a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA at CCAC. We will also look for strong performance (A's and B's) in business prerequisites such as Calculus, Macroeconomics, and Microeconomics, as well as in any other math and business courses taken. For admissions purposes, Pitt Business will consider the grade earned in these courses the first time they are taken, without including the effect of course repeats. In addition, performance at all colleges attended will be taken into consideration.

Transfer Notes

- You must earn a grade of "C" or better in a course for it to transfer.
- You may need to take other math courses to prepare for calculus. We suggest you begin taking math courses early (such as in your first semester). Your performance in math coursework will be an important factor in the admissions process.
- Due to course sequencing in our curriculum, enrollment for a minimum of four semesters in the College of Business Administration is required to earn our degree, and a minimum of five semesters is required specifically to complete a major in Supply Chain Management, Global Management, or Business Analytics. If you are looking to complete one of these majors, you may wish to transfer to Pitt Business prior to the completion of 60 credits.

Articulation Agreement
between
Community College of Allegheny County
and
University of Pittsburgh
College of Business Administration

The Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC) and the College of Business Administration (Pitt Business) at the University of Pittsburgh recognize the need and importance of facilitating the transfer of students from one institution to the other as they pursue their educational goals. In an effort to ensure that transfer students are treated on an equal basis, and to make the full resources of both institutions available to the students, the colleges enter into the following articulation agreement.

University Parallel Program - Associate in Science (Business)

Upon completion of the **CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program** specified in this document, a student may expect the following:

1. To earn the Associate of Science (Business) degree from CCAC.
2. To be guaranteed admission to the College of Business Administration provided that:
 - An overall grade point average of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale has been attained at CCAC in the CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program coursework; and,
 - A 3.00 grade point average has been attained in nine key courses noted in the CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program.

Important Note: For details about admission, please see the Guaranteed Admission Requirements section further on (underneath the CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program Required Course Listing). Students who have not met the guarantee requirements (those with lower grade point averages and/or fewer courses) are still eligible to apply for transfer admission to Pitt Business. Admissions decisions will be made after an individual review of each student's record. Although students are encouraged to complete the Associate's Degree at CCAC, it is not required for admission to the College of Business Administration.

3. To have the courses specified in the CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program accepted for transfer by the College of Business Administration. To transfer, all courses must be completed with a grade of C or

better.

4. To have all of the courses that are accepted by the College of Business Administration applied to the attainment of the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA) degree, thus resulting in the student receiving 59-60 credits and junior status in Pitt Business.

Important Note: For students interested in the Pitt Business Global Management, Supply Chain Management, or Business Analytics majors - Because of additional requirements and course sequencing, these majors require 5-6 semesters enrolled in the College of Business Administration. Students pursuing these majors should plan to transfer early on (after 30-45 credits), instead of pursuing the CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program. Students are welcome to contact Pitt Business about planning for these majors.

Admissions Process

Students who are pursuing the CCAC Associate in Science (Business) and the CCAC/Pitt Business Parallel Program will follow the academic program specified in this document. Once complete, the student will apply for transfer admission to the University of Pittsburgh. The application should be completed online and all required official academic transcripts will need to be forwarded to the University of Pittsburgh Office of Admissions and Financial Aid. Complete instructions for transfer application are found at <https://admissions.pitt.edu/transfer/>. Provided that the student has met the requirements specified earlier, they will be accepted into the College of Business Administration at the junior level.

+Guaranteed Admission Requirements - For guaranteed admission to the College of Business Administration, an overall average of 3.00/4.00 must be attained at CCAC. Also, for guaranteed admission, a 3.00 average must be attained in nine designated courses (shown above +). We will calculate the average in the nine designated courses without the effect of course repeats. The original grade earned will be considered for admission. To transfer, a course must be completed with a grade

of C or better.

In addition, if you attended another college prior to attending CCAC, please be aware that your performance there will also be considered during the admissions process for the College of Business Administration. Poor performance at a prior college can negatively impact your admission to Pitt Business even if you have otherwise met the guarantee requirements at CCAC. It is important to discuss prior college performance with your CCAC transfer counselor and any impact it may have on admission to Pitt Business.

*The humanities requirement provides an opportunity to begin fulfilling the Pitt Business foreign language requirement. The language requirement is fulfilled by 3 years of the same language completed at the high school level with a C average or two semesters of the same language taken at the college level. If you need to complete this requirement, you might want to do so at CCAC. You may count the first semester of the foreign language sequence as your CCAC humanities elective and the second semester as one of your CCAC major concentration courses.
